



Touring & Camping 2021 Info and tariffs

Homing Park is just over a couple of miles from famous Whitstable and about fifteen minutes on foot from the beach and Saxon Shore -way at Seasalter. All of the pitches are level and grassy and have the benefit of water and electric connections as well as the bonus of TV and grey-water drainage. The loos & showers have a Gold rating from the Loo of the Year people and the whole park is graded Five Stars by the tourist board.

Facilities include a tennis court*, laundry*, a five-a-side pitch, and a children's play ground. The clubhouse and swimming pool* is open at busy times and often has entertainment at weekends during the holidays. Most seasons the pool is open between May and September, although during some of that time only at weekends (*charges apply).

What's in the area?

The gem that is Whitstable, with its quaint harbour, oyster fisheries, boutique shops and galleries is a vibrant, characterful and refreshing town, and shopping and eating out locally never presented a more tempting choice of quality and style.

Local tourist attractions include Druidstone Woodland & Wildlife Park at Blean; Canterbury Cathedral; Shepherd Neame Brewery Tours, Faversham; Whitstable Museum & Art Gallery; Mount Ephraim Gardens, Hernhill; Wildwood Discovery Park, Herne Bay; Blean Woods, South Swale, and Church Woods Nature Reserves.

To avoid disappointment, book your pitch by phoning us on the number below because with only forty three pitches we do tend to fill up early, (on-line booking not available).

Despite being a Five Star park we're not the type with bowling alleys, fun-fairs and kid's crèches. Most of our offerings are straight forward, even simple, but they're clean and they're honest and we think offer good value. A lot of customers spend their time on park with their feet up reading the paper or catching up with the sport on the telly. Some of them will walk to the beach or pop into Whitstable to watch the fishing boats unload the catch, or wander in and out of the many boutique shops and coffee houses.



Some useful info and tips

- Dogs are welcome but must be kept on a lead and must not be allowed to annoy others.
- The free electricity supply is rated at 10amps but you'll need to bring an extension lead with a blue round-pin plug on one end of it to connect up to the socket on your pitch.
- We've no shop but there's a great Co-op local about eight minutes walk down the road.
- For our disabled facilities you'll need to bring your RADAR key.
- Church Lane is very narrow so if you're towing or driving a camper van make sure you approach the park from the Thanet Way end (A299).
- There's a freezer in reception for your ice packs (no food items though please).
- Please note our rules (printed below) about cycling, tent sizes, and commercial vehicles.

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On Bank Holiday weekends there's a minimum booking of three nights one of which must be Saturday. There is a surcharge of £2.50/night for each additional person.

Gazebos (open sided only) are limited to a max of 3m x 3m, and are £5.00/night - if yours is bigger than this you will be instructed to dismantle it or to pay for an additional pitch to put it on.

Day visitors must check in and out at reception and pay the £3.00/ person entry charge.

How To Find Us

From London and Medway towns, head down the M2 & A299 towards Ramsgate. Turn off the A299 for Canterbury/Whitstable and then look out for the brown caravan and camping sign then turn left into Church Lane.

The park entrance has two large flagpoles. From Canterbury, turn left at the roundabout where the A2990 meets the A290, proceed down the hill and over another roundabout to the bottom where you will cross over the slip road into Church Lane.

- For your safety, cycling skateboarding and scooters etc are forbidden, and we have a 10mph speed limit.
- We are unable to accept tents larger than five metres long or wide or greater than 8 berths.
